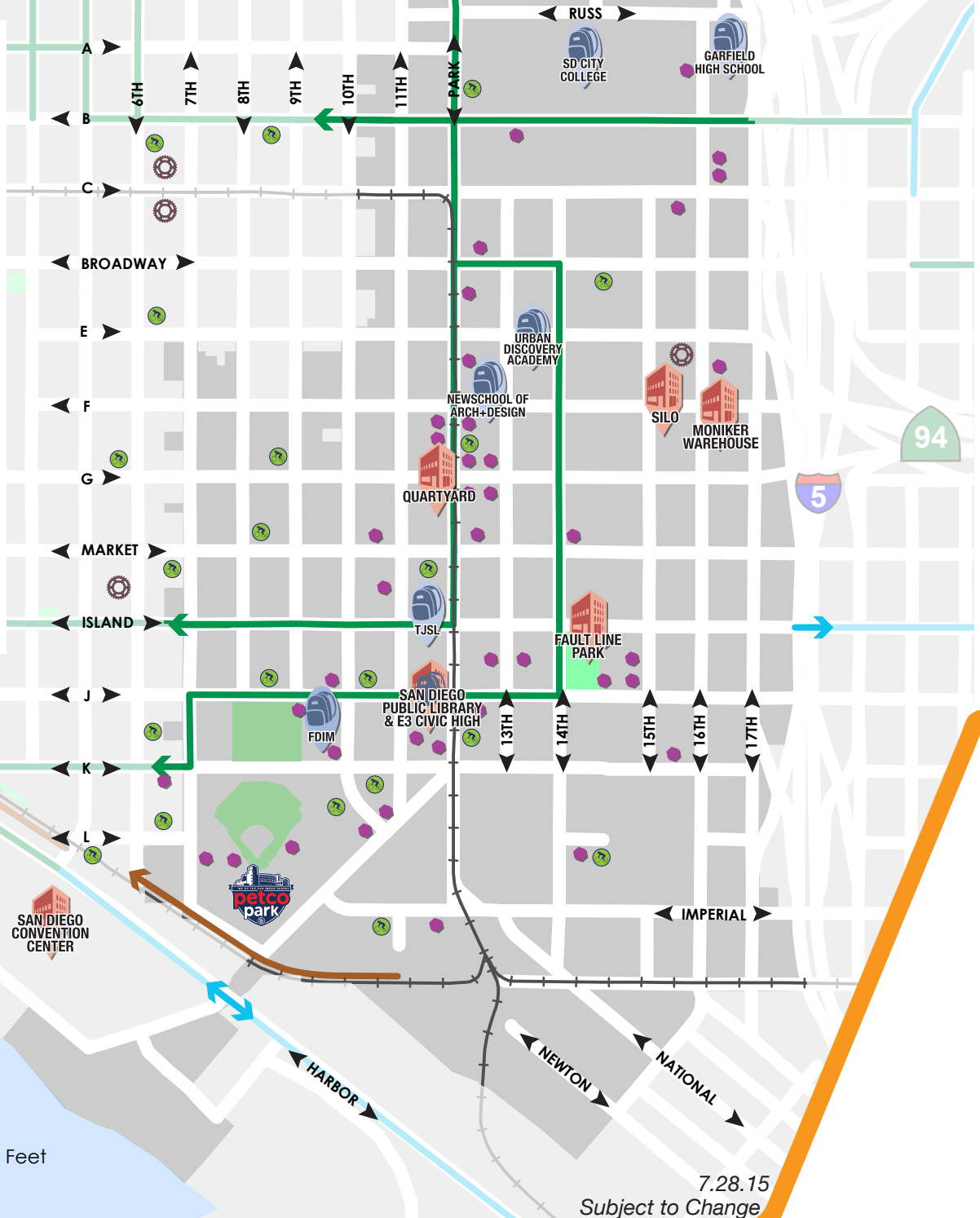

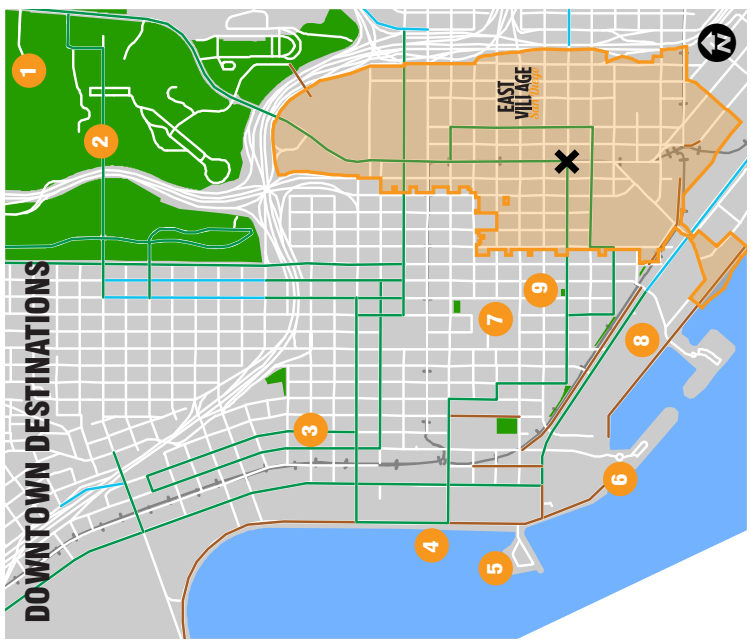
DOWNTOWN DESTINATIONS



WELCOME TO EAST VILLAGE

East Village is San Diego's largest downtown neighborhood encompassing 130 blocks, between Seventh Avenue east to 18th Street. More than 700 businesses are located in the thriving urban enclave, including restaurants, hotels, art galleries, PETCO Park, and the new San Diego Central Library.

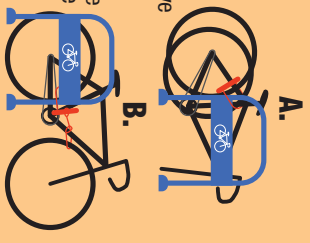
Several educational institutions are also located in East Village including Thomas Jefferson School of Law (TJSL), NewSchool of Architecture + Design, Fashion Institute of Design and Merchandising (FDIM), and San Diego City College. Continuing urban development and the steady growth of new businesses creates a diverse, ever-evolving, and vibrant community with a unique mix of arts, culture, education, and entertainment.



HOW TO...

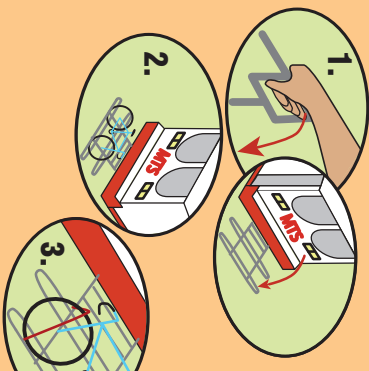
Properly Secure Your Bike

1. Find a bicycle rack or sturdy pole (Avoid scaffolding, railings and fencing)
2. With a quick release front tire, remove the front tire and secure to the back tire and frame as seen in example A
3. Otherwise, secure a wheel and frame to the rack and use a chain to secure the other wheel (example B)
4. Avoid securing bike by the top tube and never leave bike unsecured

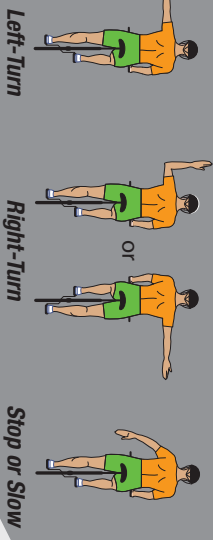


Bring Bikes on Transit

1. Squeeze handle to lower the bike rack
2. Load your bicycle into an empty slot
3. Raise the support arm up and over the front tire



RIDING TIPS



Don't Forget to..

1. Make eye contact with drivers
2. Wear bright clothes
3. Wear a helmet

Nighttime Equipment

1. Front and rear lights or reflectors
2. Wheel and Pedal reflectors
